






How many Veterans?

- 20 Million Veterans (9.4 % Female)
- 2.6 million plus, deployed to combat zones in Iraq and Afghanistan since 2001
- 52,892 Wounded, as of 19 August 2019 (145 in 2018)
- 7,001 Killed, as of 19 August 2019 (37 in 2018)
- Operation Inherent Resolve (Iraq) and Freedom Sentinel (Afghanistan) replaced Operation New Dawn and Enduring Freedom



- **Culture** is the way of life for a society. As such, it includes codes of :
 - *Manners, dress, language, religion, rituals,* norms of behavior such as *law and morality*, and systems of belief as well as the arts and *gastronomy*.
- Cultural Competence refers to an ability to interact effectively with people of different cultures.
- Developing cultural competence results in an ability to understand, communicate with, and effectively interact with people across cultures.



Ranks and Titles and Class

- There are three general categories of rank/rate:
 - o Enlisted personnel (E1-E9) and Non-Commissioned Officers
 - Warrant Officers (WO1-CW5)
 - o Commissioned Officers (O1-O9).
- All commissioned officers "out-rank" all warrant officers and enlisted members. All warrant officers "outrank" all enlisted members.
- There are some operational anomalies:

A brand new commissioned officer in the grade of O-1, would "out-rank" an E-9, Army Sergeant Major, (however, any 2nd lieutenant (Butter Bar) stupid enough to unnecessarily "pull rank" on an E-9 would quickly find him/herself having a talk with his/her own boss).
