



National Drug Court Online Learning System Tribal Healing to Wellness Curriculum

Interviewee Information

The Center for Court Innovation (the Center)—with the support of the US Department of Justice's Bureau of Justice Assistance—hosts the [National Drug Court Online Learning System](http://www.drugcourtonline.org) at www.drugcourtonline.org.

The first resource of its kind, the National Drug Court Online Learning System offers free access to cutting-edge training on a wide array of subjects, including the psychopharmacology of addiction, sanctions and incentives, and trauma-informed care..

The Center is partnering with the Tribal Law and Policy Institute to help enhance the [Online Learning System](#) by developing a Tribal Healing to Wellness Court (HTWC) curriculum. The HTWC curriculum will include video lessons, practitioner interviews, a virtual site visit, and a resource library.

The Center will film practitioner interviews at the Tribal Wellness Courts Enhancement Training in Albuquerque, NM on September 8-10. The interviewees will include judges, prosecutors, defense attorneys, lay advocates, treatment providers, probation, law enforcement, and community outreach workers.

What to expect during your interview

Center staff will sit down with you and ask a series of questions relevant to your role in your court setting. The interviewer will not be on camera, and his or her questions will be edited out of the final version. The interviews are filmed in 'talking head' format, meaning that the camera focuses only on the presenter while he or she is speaking.

The interview will last approximately 20-30 minutes.

Center staff will ask you general questions such as what advice do you have for others in your position, what challenges and successes have you faced in your role, , and what is unique about working in a tribal community.

The footage will be edited, so it is okay to do a retake if you are not satisfied with your answer.

Please dress how you would dress for a regular work day. If possible, avoid an all-black or all green outfit as it may interfere with the background.
